### Ask Father James:

### What is the definition of a parish and does our parish fit this definition?

There is an official canon law definition of a what a parish is; (c. 515), but to answer your question, I like to adopt the definition that Pope Francis gave recently on what a parish is and should be. Everyone reading this piece would better judge if our parish fits this definition. Pope Francis in his first encyclical letter to the whole church, *Evangelium Gaudium* or The Joy of the Gospel, defines the parish in the following words:

"The parish is the presence of the Church in a given territory, an environment for hearing God's word, for growth in the Christian life, for dialogue, proclamation, charitable outreach, worship and celebration. In all its activities the parish encourages and trains its members to be evangelizers. It is a community of communities, a sanctuary where the thirsty come to drink in the midst of their journey, and a centre of constant missionary outreach. We must admit, though, that the call to review and renew our parishes has not yet sufficed to bring them nearer to people, to make them environments of living communion and participation, and to make them completely mission-oriented" (See EG #28).

"The parish is not an outdated institution; precisely because it possesses great flexibility, it can assume quite different contours depending on the openness and missionary creativity of the pastor and the community. While certainly not the only institution which evangelizes, if the parish proves capable of self-renewal and constant adaptivity, it continues to be "the Church living in the midst of the homes of her sons and daughters." This presumes that it really is in contact with the homes and the lives of its people, and does not become a useless structure out of touch with people or a self-absorbed group made up of a chosen few."

In #49, Francis famously remarks that he prefers a dirty church. "Consequently, writes Pope Francis, an evangelizer must never look like someone who has just come back from a funeral!" (EG #10). "There are some Christians whose lives are like Lent without Easter" (#7). Thus, Pope Francis says; "Instead of seeming to impose new obligations, all parishioners should appear as people who wish to share their joy, who point to a horizon of beauty and who invite others to a delicious banquet. It is not by proselytizing that the Church grows, but 'by attraction'." (#14). Thus, "all of us are asked to obey his call to go forth from our own comfort zone in order to reach all the "peripheries" in need of the light of the Gospel" (#20) and in #46 and #48, he speaks of "going out ...to reach the fringes of humanity."

In #182, the Pope offers us hints on how to do evangelization. He says; 'Jesus is the first and greatest evangelizer. In every activity of evangelization, the primacy always belongs to God who has called us to cooperate with him. The church must be a place of mercy freely given, where everyone can feel welcomed, loved, forgiven and encouraged to live the good life of the Gospel (#114). It is no longer possible to claim that religion should be restricted to the private sphere and that it exists only to prepare souls for heaven. We know that God wants his children to be happy in this world too, even though they are called to fulfillment in eternity, for he has created all things "for our enjoyment" (1 Tim 6:17), the enjoyment of everyone. It follows that Christian conversion demands reviewing especially those areas and aspects of life "related to the social order and the pursuit of the common good."


