Souls on Fire: I have come to bring fire on the earth! (Luke 12:49)

Jesus in Luke 12:49, says that he came to bring fire on earth. This passage is one of many that has been misunderstood by some passersby Bible readers. Truly, Jesus' fire imagery can be very disturbing! Fire is a dangerous image. Why would God bring fire to the earth? This fire is not to be taken literally. Jesus is talking of the divine fire. Christ is not preaching jihad; he's predicting the impact his message of love will have on our self-centered human nature. To help us understand this better, Jesus in the very next verse, in Luke 12:50 said "I have a baptism." The spiritual reality that will turn the value system of the world around. He was referring to the baptism of the Holy Spirit. Jesus says it would even divide members of a family from one another! If we allow the fire of this baptism to burn within our souls, it would be, in fact, the fire that purifies us, the spiritual Word that destroys the worst in us. This Fire cannot be ignored. Recall that it was this Fire that purified the lips of Isaiah (Isaiah 6:7-8). It was this Fire that consumed the altar of the false gods of Ba'al (1Kings 18:25) and it was the fire of the burning bush that changed the life of Moses forever (Exodus 3:1-15). Let your soul be on Fire.

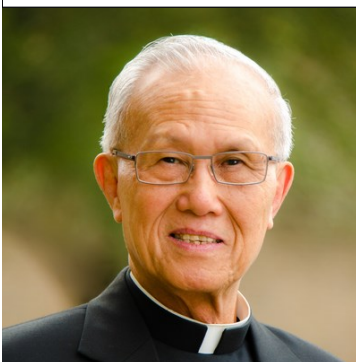
STEWARDSHIP CORNER
