Ask Father James:

Was it really Jesus' intention to establish a Church?

The question that is sometimes asked is: Was it really Jesus' intention to establish a Church? In Matthew 16:17-19, Jesus said; "Blessed are you Peter... I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church." Thus, the Church did not come into being by accident. God's purpose is not to save individual souls in isolation from one another, but to build a Church, to gather together into one a people of his own, drawn from every nation and culture. Christians are brothers and sisters, siblings in God's family through Christ, citizens of his Kingdom and stones in his temple (Eph 2:19-22).

Unfortunately, today, the word 'church' (*ekklesia*) bears a lot of negative connotations in itself. It is connected with the idea of an old-fashioned club for people with extreme spiritual needs. Others identify it as a chilly and old organization, which is conservative, standing against progress in human evolution, and riddled with sexual abuse scandals and they resent its perceived desire for power and money. Following Christ's intent, the church, since its foundation, has no political mission, but serves a religious mission. The church does this through its sanctifying mission - leading people to have "intimate union with God" and to love one another - "unity of all humankind" its social mission (Matthew 22:34-40).

Historically, human beings have always longed for these two purposes. In the Bible, the Jewish people expected a spiritual messiah - The one who is to lead them to a New Exodus. The Old Exodus was from Egypt to the Promised Land - Jerusalem. The New Exodus was to be a spiritual relationship with God leading to a liberation from principalities and powers, evil forces that daily oppress them. Jesus knew this and wanted to help the world to become free; hence his response to Peter's declaration of his messianic identity with a promise to "build" the church "upon" a "rock" and give him the "keys" to the kingdom (Matthew 16:17-19).

He told Peter, "... I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven..." which means the keys to open and close blessings of "my church." The church belongs to Jesus Christ and he established it to give grace and blessing to the people of God. The word blessing (*makarios*) in Greek Language and as used in the New Testament means the distinctive joy which comes to a person when they share in the salvation of the Kingdom of God. The church was established to give blessing to those who join it by responding to the invitation from Christ. That was why Christ gave the church the power to bind and loose; that is; to free people from bondage and captivity (Luke 4:18-21).

The Book of Revelation 1:18 speaks of Jesus having the keys of Death and Hades and it is this key that Jesus handed over to Peter and the apostles for "Binding and Loosing" (Matthew 18:18) or for the forgiveness and retention of sins (Matthew 16:19; John 20:23). The church is an attacking force against death and evil forces; it is equipped with all the power it needs to resist such an attack. The church exists to help us so that the gates of Hades - powers and authority of the underworld - the realm of the ungodly dead or 'powers of evil' - 'shall not prevail against us.





BREAKING Bingo NEWS

FACTS, Questions & Answers

Is Bingo the primary fundraiser for Our Lady of Peace Parish?

No and Yes.

No. The parish has numerous fundraisers throughout the year; however, all non-liturgical events within the bricks and mortar of the church are prohibited at this time. Yes, Bingo fundraising is currently the only approved and primary fundraiser for the parish.

How much does bingo fundraising contribute to parish finances each year?

A substantial amount! It's the parish's highest revenue source among fundraisers. In 2019 our team raised \$15,178.40! To date, in 2020 our team has raised \$9,287.08.

How many people currently participate on the parish's bingo team?

Our dedicated team consists of only 10 people.

How many people are required each month and at each bingo session?

A minimum of 40 people per month are required and 12 people are needed for each bingo session.

Wow! 40 people per month and our dedicated parish team only consists of 10?

Yes, and like you and me and everyone else, our team tires out.

What will I be doing while helping at bingo?

There are a few key tasks such as: selling bingo paper to patrons, providing patrons with winnings and providing change.

How may I donate my time?

Bingo sessions are only 3 hours long with loads of fun and laughter!

What is the minimum age requirement for helping at bingo?

With permission of parents/guardians, students 14 and up may participate, and students are paid for their time!

I have safety concerns due to COVID-19, what precautions are followed?

All government safety guidelines and protocol are strictly adhered to. All surfaces are sanitized and disinfected and protective face masks are required.

What happens if more assistance isn't found?

The bingo fundraising will stop and the parish will lose a significant revenue stream. Every single parishioner would be required to substantially increase their weekly offering and ministries may need to be cut.

Now that I understand the importance of this fundraiser, how may I help?

The Bingo Team is providing two simple options for helping.

OPTION # 1.) Consider committing only 3 hours per month.

OPTION #2.) Instead of participating at the bingo hall, make a monetary donation to the fundraising efforts.

For example: John Doe cannot assist at a bingo, but he wants to help. John Doe donates \$20.00 to the bingo
