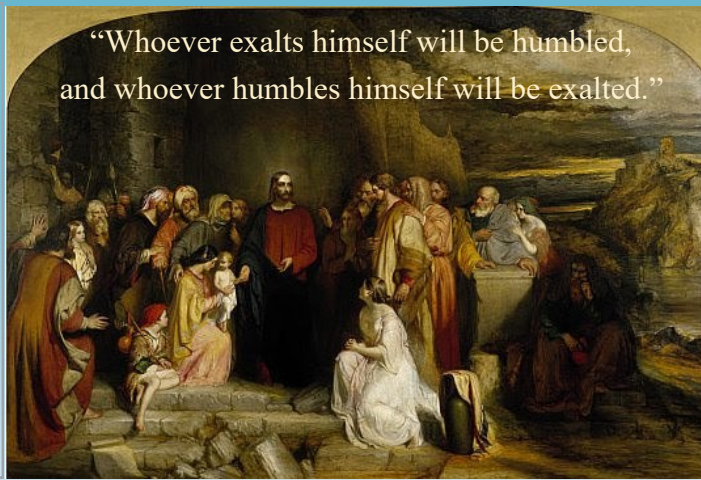

MINISTRING TO THE DISABLED IN THE CHURCH

Jesus was invited on a Sabbath to eat at the home of "one of the leading Pharisees," along with several other scribes and Pharisees, who were "watching Him closely" (Luke 14:1). At some point during the meal, Jesus told the host that from now on, whenever he gave a feast, he was to prioritize "the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind" (Luke 14:13). Not surprisingly, questions have been posed about the identity of the individuals?

In the Gospels, the Poor are those struggling spiritually (poor in spirit), the lame are sinners (considered not doing their best to be holy roller) and the blind are the Gentiles (followers of other gods). Jesus was in the company of the Pharisees, the "supposed Holy rollers" who separated themselves from the riffraff of society and treat "the poor, blind, lame, as persons of low status and outside the bounds of God's banquet table. Their understanding was that these people are unworthy and also couldn't help meet the economic upkeep of the temple. This too can happen at our church, at the Lord's Supper (the Mass), which can become turned into a gathering whereby worshippers are viewed by their status and thereby breeding inequality, injustice, discrimination.

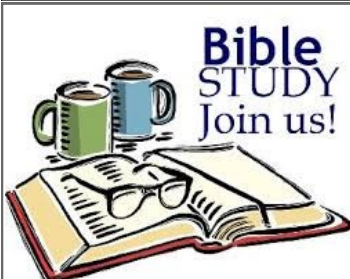
STEWARDSHIP CORNER

"Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you."

-Luke 14:13-14

One of the main principles of living a stewardship lifestyle is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in our "consumerist" culture that we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, you pay money and receive something in return, it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.

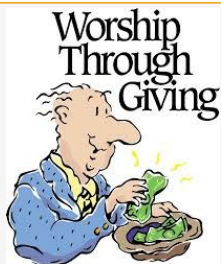

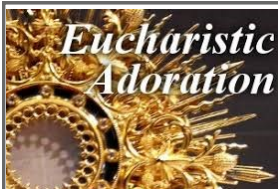
