Understanding Christian Stewardship

The parable of the Rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31) tells us about the reality of heaven and hell. This parable has been misunderstood as advocating a reversal of roles in which if one is living a good life on earth, then they will live a bad life after death. The parable does not mean to teach that the rich will go to hades, after all, Abraham was rich in his earthly lifetime. Jesus tells the parable to help us understand what scriptures teaches about wealth. The context of the parable relates to the stewardship of God-given resources (Luke 16:9-13). That those who have not been faithful in handling the gifts of God (worldly wealth) should not expect anyone to trust them with true riches in heaven (Luke 16:11). The rich man is depicted as indifferent to the social conditions of his community. Christian charity and stewardship enjoin us not to overlook the hardships of the poor. The parable depicts that there is only one life to be lived and one's life must be guided by the scriptures what (Moses and the Prophets and the Gospels teach about wealth).




