

On this Thanksgiving Weekend, we are called to emulate the thankful Samaritan. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, (Luke 17:11-19), The Samaritan saw what Jesus had done for him, ...

He threw himself at Jesus' feet and

thanked him

The word "thanked" here and in verse 16 is Greek *eucharisteō*. This is to show that one is under obligation, to do *eucharisteō*. During our Eucharistic celebrations, we do all the above *eucharisteō* gestures of the Samaritan's actions.

Jesus receives his thanks graciously. Gratitude is an important component in our salvation. Our gratitude to the Lord is expected. This is what the Mass helps us to do. This is what the Thanksgiving weekend is all about. Arise and give thanks for the Lord has done marvels for you. When we give thanks to God, we too would hear Jesus' departing blessing to the thankful Samaritan: 'Rise and go; your faith has saved you.'" (Luke 17:19).

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time


"Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" Luke 17:18

Reflection

The readings at Mass speak to us about healing – both in physical and spiritual ways. We hear the account of Naaman the Syrian being

cleansed of his leprosy in the Jordan. When he is healed, his faith is healed as well. The prophet Elisha helps him realize that his healing was a special gift of God, and not something that can be bought. Saint Paul's letter to Timothy tells us that God is faithful to us. Sometimes the world we live in makes it challenging to live out the Gospel, but when we know that God is always with us, even if we reject that relationship, giving us the confidence to respond to His voice in generous and creative ways. When Jesus heals the lepers in the gospel, only the Samaritan gives praise to him. Samaritans were bitter enemies of the Jews, and so it makes the encounter even more powerful. Jesus shows us that the love and healing mercy of God is available to all. With the generous support that the Annual Appeal receives, many ministries of healing are able to happen. With outreach to the poor, to spiritual care in our healthcare system, your financial support contributes to many people being able to hear the healing words of Christ and experience His love.
