

# "On the need to pray always and not to lose heart" (Luke 18:1-8)

This weekend's parable is about the Power of Persistence in prayer. In the parable Jesus tells of a widow who encountered a (person), a judge who doesn't fear God. She kept pestering the judge for vindication of her rights. She was probably up against a wealthy opponent and his bribes. The unjust judge finally gives way to the woman because of her persistence. Jesus says, God is unlike the judge. God will vindicate God's elect people if they are persistent. In prayer. Persistence means not to "lose heart." Meaning that prayer is not like a vending machine where you put a coin in and. It spits out the bottle. The parable teaches us that when we come to God in prayer, we need to persist despite failure and silence. Jesus concludes this text by asking: "And when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?" Meaning, will he find persistent Christians?

### Reflection

Anyone who has tried to start a new exercise regimen or learn an instrument understands that it takes persistence. Being persistent in anything is hard though – it asks us to endure

resistance, at times being uncomfortable or boring. The readings today help us understand that our faith is like a muscle that needs to be exercised. At times our faith comes easily, but other times it takes persistence to grow in the spiritual life. The account of Moses being persistent in his help to the army of Israel, Paul's exhortation to Timothy to be persistent in following the Gospel, and Jesus's parable of the dishonest judge show us that we must be persistent in our faith. We can never annoy God with our prayers! The more we enter into prayer and do the work of the Church, the more our spiritual muscles are exercised. But, as we know, many hands make light work.
