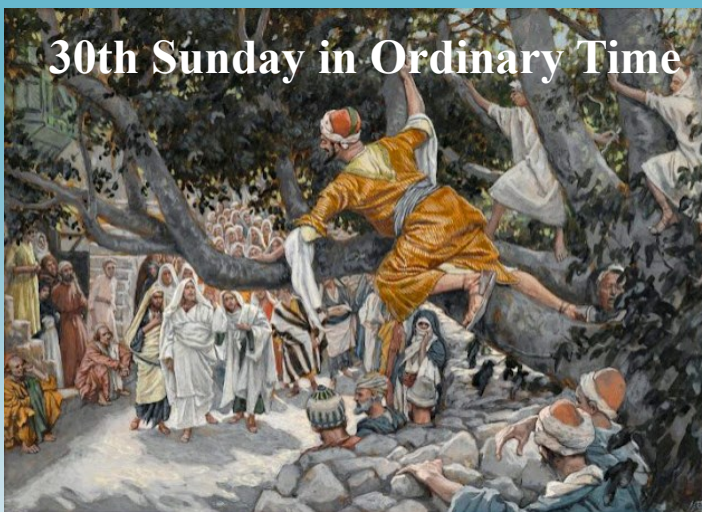

ASK FATHER JAMES:

“How not to Pray in the House of God “ (Luke 18:9-14)

In this Sunday's gospel reading, Jesus in the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector (publican) teaches us how not to pray. Jesus says, two men went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee asks for nothing but God's appreciative attention and praise for all he has been doing. For his flawless faithfulness every day – paying his tithes, fasting, and saying tons of prayer. The Pharisees concluded his prayer by saying: “God, I thank you that I'm not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax-collector. The tax collector on the other hand begs God for mercy on himself a sinner. The tax collector bowed his head, avoids narrating a long list of his own vices and virtues to God, but he names his condition: he's a sinner. He beats his chest and pleads for mercy. Jesus said, I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other" The lesson of the parable is simple: God gave same gift to each: eyes to see the truth about who we really are and power to admit the truth before God and become most fully the persons that Christ calls us to be.

Reflection



Today is world mission Sunday, which reminds us of the missionary activity of the Church. The first reading from Sirach reminds us that God does not have any favorite people and hears the cries of the vulnerable and marginalized. St. Paul reminds us too that even those who have no one to stand up for them are still held in the Heart of the Lord, echoing Sirach in our duty to ensure solidarity with the oppressed, the poor, the marginalized, the strangers. The gospel hits us hard – do we sometimes want to distance ourselves from others? Do we place ourselves on a pedestal? Do we become blind to the needs of the poor and the world? We sometimes think of missionary work as being done in a country far away, detached from our lives. There are many ways of being a missionary in our communities, both in terms of our own generous response to the Lord in working in that ministry, but also in our support of those missionaries near and far. Through the Annual Appeal, your contributions are used to help support the missionary activity of the Church. We need to reach out to those that have not heard the Good News of the Gospel, and your support helps make this a reality.

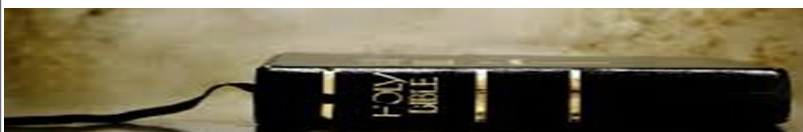
