## Pastor's Report - Father James

I like to personally thank all parishioners for the relationship with Jesus Christ and relationships with one another that we have cultivated in this parish. Your joyful response in embracing all the new ministry outreach, and stewardship mission initiatives that we undertake has really helped our parish's vision and mission. Everybody has been very supportive and feeling part of everyone else life in moments of joy and moments of struggles and this has made our church an involved congregation. As Catholic Christians, we all have responsibility to build the kingdom of God and it is so visible to all that we have adopted the biblical concept of "welcoming the strangers" and especially knowing that the stranger-guests and new parishioners may have something to offer "us, the receptive host" (Genesis 18 and Matthew 25: 35-40).

For the year 2018, our vision after our church renovation project of 2017 was to focus on congregational membership transformation for spiritual and financial growth. To embark on this successfully, we needed human and financial resources to aid our spiritual understanding of our baptismal commitment through new ministry initiatives. By baptism, the Christian is called to growth in personal holiness and to the transformation of society through evangelization. I invited us as church to embark on this vision with a view to balancing social mission, and spiritual growth and you responded generously. Just like the early Christians in the Acts of the Apostles, our efforts at transforming our community of grace and helping us attain personal holiness and community holiness is working.

Through your active participation in the parish' life this past year, I am happy to announce that we finished the year 2018 with a \$9,182.000 net surplus. The various fundraising activities of all the different groups in the parish netted \$38, 542.000. Special thanks to all for your support of our daily operations and budget. Because of your support in 2018, we have been able to install a new baptismal font, a new presider chair to replace the almost 40 year old one, installed new sanctuary LED florescence lights and we were able to achieve over 83% of our goal for the Annual Archbishop's Appeal. And with your help and your donation, we plan to purchase new Mass vestments and to renovate the rectory bathroom.

Your donations continued to help us have a Catholic Church presence in the Uplands and the North East area of the City of Regina. Your support continues to help us with our operating budget costs and also in the on-going paying down of our church mortgage accruing from the major church renovations that we undertook in 2017. May Christ our Saviour continue to renew our hearts and rekindle the desire in us to build a parish church to be handed over to the next generation like our ancestors did for us.

May God continue to bless you and your family.

In the spring, council started working on plans for a one day Mission at Little Flower Parish. The mission date was May 12, 2018. Time: 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM. The theme was Mercy & Evangelization, with Harley Packer. The conference was poorly attended. The food was donated to the Marion Centre.

The council gathered and recorded any and all prayer practices and sacramental preparation materials and classes at our parishes. The idea was to share and distribute the information to the parishes.

Discussions are ongoing about clergy sexual abuse, Truth and Reconciliation, protocol and how as parishes we can help. No fee or registration. Still planning so more information to come.

At Our Lady of Peace Parish, we have dedicated ladies who so faithfully visit and bring Holy Communion to the shut-ins in the community. Thank-you to CWL who donate cards and cookies at Christmas that are given to our shut-ins.

Many thanks to Father James who once a month visits and celebrates Mass with the Elders at Regina Lutheran Home which is greatly appreciated by the Elders and Staff. Many other Elders join in the celebration for a blessing given by Father. About twice a year, Father also administers the Sacrament "Anointing of the Sick" to Elders at the home. Thank-you to Tillie Tourney, Agnes Joo and Sadie Zerr who always come every month to help the Elders with walkers and wheel chairs to be able to attend Mass.

## Annual Appeal – *Antonette Rothecker*

In the early part of this year the Appeal Office sent out their first mail out.

This was to get to some of the people who are not away for the summer months. This small amount of collections is a cushion for the remainder of the big amount required.

The program starts in September by having a supper and speakers.

The monies collected is for programs that the parish wish to have and need funding for to assist all in keeping our faith strong.

The Appeal goal for 2018 was \$1,600,000.00 for all of the Diocese. We made \$17,323.00.

Our goal for Our Lady of Peace was \$20,846.00. We increased our donations from last year to this year by \$3,448.70.

We made 83% of our goal for 2018. I hope with the grace of God, we, the parishioners will keep on increasing the amount to make our goal for 2019. I would like to thank my assistant, Jackie Baran and Doris Frei for their help in calling the parishioners. I believe with this help we came close to our goal. Thanks girls.

## Parish School Liaison – Antonette Rothecker

Parish Liaison to St. Gregory, St. Michael & Mother Theresa Middle School.

Monthly CSCC meetings are attended at each school. The meetings are to keep the Parish & the schools abreast all activities in school academics and spiritual teachings.

St. Gregory has 285 students, St Michaels have approximately 165 students and Mother Theresa has 63 students. We have new staff at St. Gregory and St. Michael schools this year

St. Gregory's new principal is Leanne Forrester and vice principal is Carmel Nicolson and office manager is Carry Foord.

The new principal at St. Michael is Tammy Appell.

All three schools have vibrant programs, keeping all students scholastically inclined and active. All the students want to have the best education, but these attributes are earned by hard work and good attendance. They are still using the Mathletic's Program and everyone is enjoying this way to teaching.

The School Board has implemented a program where the teachers and parents are involved with the activities the students are in. This year I was invited to a meeting at Mother Theresa Middle School. They started the meeting by an elder smudging, then he spoke to the students after the meeting and supper was served, a very interesting night. They do not have a CSCC group, they have individual class meetings with the parents and teachers.

The teachers are trying to get all classes completed. The CWL have given to each of the three Catholic schools in the area \$200.00 for the Angel Fund and also sponsor a child from each school to attend Camp Monahan in the summer months.

The Knights of Columbus donated 2 large boxes of winter jackets to St. Gregory and St. Michael schools. Every year the CWL gives each child a birthday card for all 3 schools. The students look forward in getting a card each year.

The Knights will also be sponsoring children to go to Camp Monahan.

We can only hope all parents take an interest in their children's learning year and take interest in the curriculum of the schools teaching plus the spiritual aspect of the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ.

All schools are busy getting ready for Easter. Let's wish all is well and hope the students take with them great knowledge learned throughout the year. We wish all a good safe summer vacation. I want to give each teacher extreme amount of kudos for all they do with the children in the schools. They are not only teachers they are mentors, care givers and much more.

## Protocol – Donalda Exner

First of all, I would like to thank Father James, my screening committee, the members of the Parish Council and the volunteers of Our Lady of Peace Parish for their continuous support.

The purpose of Responsible Ministry Protocol:

- -To respond to and protect the vulnerable members of our parishes and to protect the financial assets entrusted to us by our parishes.
- -To respond to the requirements of the insurance carriers of the Western Canadian (Arch) dioceses.

There are two categories for Responsible Ministry Protocol:

-HIGH SECURITY: ANYONE WHO IS DEALING WITH CHILDREN, SENIORS OR MONEY. If you are in this category you MUST get a Criminal Records Check from the Regina City Police. They will require a letter from the parish (Office Manager Rob) indicating that you are a volunteer and the cost will be \$10. If you want to be reimbursed submit your receipt to Rob. The Archdiocese requests that a Criminal Records Check for each High Security volunteer be done every five years. You will be informed when your renewal comes up.

-GENERAL SECURITY: Those volunteers that are Extraordinary Ministers, Readers, Lectors, Greeters, Gift Bearers, and Choir Members etc. do not require a Criminal Records Check.

ALL new volunteers must fill out the General Information Form that you can pick up from Rob or me. If you have been serving as a volunteer and have not filled out the necessary forms please contact me at 306-543-2728. It is up to the coordinator of each ministry to update me on new volunteers so they can fill out the necessary forms that are needed to help keep our records up to date.

## CWL (Catholic Women's League) - Irene Haynes

Another year has turned over too quickly. Our CWL has worked hard to provide for the women of the parish and the rest of the Parish Family. Like everyone else, we are trying to adjust to changes small and large.

Age is one of those changes which is both obvious and deceptive. In short, we keep on going until we cannot. We are tired but not retired. I won't say that we are on our last legs, but if you push us too hard we might fall over and not get up. We are in serious need of some younger women. Aside from that obvious fact, most people have probably not noticed very much change. We have continued to do things we have done before.

We continue to serve at one mass every month, the second Sunday of the month. We had the Woman's World Day of Prayer in March. We are involved with the larger CWL community in the diocese, the province and the nation. We involve ourselves with the schools in our community and with our children at baptism, 1<sup>st</sup> communion and confirmation. We also provide a yearly scholarship for the graduates. We have been donating funds yearly for school projects and for camp fees for school projects for Camp Monahan. We support Visitation House and other local charities.

We provide funeral brunches for our parishioners at a minimum cost and try to support our parish both physically and financially. Many thanks to all of those women who keep baking and keep the family fed.

Our two major fundraisers: The Craft Sale and the Leas Market are still being held. Our profits are smaller due to our smaller facility, but so far we have decided to proceed with them.

Our membership is dwindling and more seems to be expected from each member. On the other hand, it is nice to see how the men and women of the parish are working together to get the various jobs done. Perhaps good will and the Holy Spirit will keep us going for longer than we feel we can manage.
