RCIA/RCIC - begins in Fall - Call Fr. Peter to register or more info.


Reconciliation - celebrated before every Weekday, and Sunday Mass or call Fr. Peter for an appointment.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear parishioners of Our Lady of Peace Parish,

On the 11th Sunday in ordinary time, June 14th 2015, we reflected on the mustard seed that Jesus compares it as Kingdom of God. It is the smallest seed but it has the potential to become big. The faith can be compared as the smallest seed too but it can become powerful.

In today's gospel, Jesus insists the faith as powerful, as it can allow God to act and transform our lives. He said to the woman suffering from haemorrhages for twelve years who touched his clothes hoping for healing: "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease." (Mk 5.25-29) Faith itself has no power. It is God who has power but faith opens us to receive God's grace which empowers us and transforms us.
