PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear parishioners of Our Lady of Peace Parish,

In today's St. Mark's Gospel, it is ridiculous that "John and James came forward to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." And Jesus said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you." And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." (Mk 10.35-40) In Matthew's Gospel, the mother of John and James came to ask Jesus positions for her sons. (Mt 20.20) No matter who ask Jesus, we can see that they do not understand the meaning of Jesus' life as Messiah. This happens the same as at the Transfiguration, Peter asked Jesus to let him build dwelling places right at the scene (Matt 17.4; Mk 9.5 and Lk 9.33). Last week, a man asked Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life and tells Jesus that he has kept all the commandments since his youth. (Mk 10.20) This is very good. There is nothing wrong with all of these but they all think about themselves rather than relationship with God and with others.

We too, often ask from (pray) God about ourselves. Jesus came into the world not about himself but all about his relationship with the Father and about us who have been separated from the Father. All his focus is about doing his Father's will which is all to be saved.

We too often count everything we do but neglect God's love for us and responding to his love. We think only of ourselves rather than our relationship with God and with others as God loves them all. This is our biggest problem that impede us to grow in relationship with God and with one another. not laugh at John, James and Peter or anyone else rather we must reflect on how we do respond to God and reflect his love to others. We all must try our best with God's help.
