ASK FATHER JAMES:

MONEY MATTERS AND JESUS

In our Gospel for this weekend, Luke 12:13-21, Jesus responded to a request for financial advice from a person in the crowd saying: "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." Jesus then uses the occasion to teach about the perils of wealth through the parable of the rich man who made provision for his future by his material wealth but neglected his spiritual state. Him dying unexpectedly that very night and incurring God's judgment. Jesus concludes, "So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God." Life is itself a gift from God. God and mammon (money/ wealth) represent two antithetical wellsprings that pull our intentions and actions in different directions. The conclusion to be drawn from the lesson Jesus was teaching is the last verse which says, "so it is with those who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich toward God." The man was called a "fool" because he failed in the account of "giving to God." He only plans to enjoy his possessions despite the uncertainty of the future and the inevitability of his own death. *Do you have a faith question? Email Father James: frjames@sasktel.net*


