ASK FATHER JAMES:

Parable of the Good Samaritan: "Go and Do Likewise (Luke 10:37)

Luke 10:25-37 presents a dialogue between Jesus and a lawyer. The lawyer approaches Jesus to ask him, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus doesn't answer the question directly. Instead, he appeals to the lawyer, "What is written in the Law?' The lawyer answered: Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind"; and "Love your neighbor as yourself," quoting Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 19:18, respectively. Jesus compliments him on his answer: "You have answered correctly." Like many of us, the lawyer worships God but falls short in the aspect of love of neighbour. Jesus seizes the opportunity to tell the parable of the Good Samaritan. Jesus in this parable helps us to understand mercy. The lesson of the story is Love is action, not emotion. Jesus orders the lawyer to go and follow the example of the Samaritan who acted with mercy. The Greatest Commandment can be mere words. So, Jesus directs the lawyer to put the principle into action and treat others with mercy, love, and compassion. Thus, Jesus' concluding remark, "go and do likewise."






