The Parable of the Sower: A Lesson on Seeding with God to reap a hundred-fold back.

Jesus begins his teaching on the parable of the Sower (Matthew 13:23) by saying: A farmer went out to sow his seed (Matthew 13:1). Sowing is the biblical way of describing investing or seeding with God. The biblical principle of seeding or sowing is explained spiritually as broadcasting unsparingly as opposed to being miserly and withholding frugally from God. (See Proverbs 11:24-25, Luke 6:38, 2 Cor. 9:6). Meaning that there are returns when one broadcasts the word of God. In this Sunday's text, Jesus teaches us about the lessons and gains of broadcasting seeds like the sower in the parable of the Sower.

People sow money on political parties, and sports clubs in order to reap returns. Jesus says the same about investing with God. In the Parable of the Sower, there were seeds that went to waste – eaten by birds, fell on rocky grounds, fell among thorns, and choked to death. Some Christians too waste their seeds in places having no chance to germinate and grow.

In the parable, Jesus says about the "word of the kingdom" (v. 19), invest unsparingly in the sowing of God's word by your resources and prayerful actions and God will produce a fruitful harvest. We often tend to become very stingy with our personal possessions and resources; guarding them; protecting them. Jesus invites us to invest in sowing the Word. Be like the seed in the good soil, not like those seeds that were snatched away by birds or choked by thorns. Don't let the cares of this world and the lure of wealth make the Word "unfruitful." In Genesis 26:12: "Isaac sowed seed in that land, and in the same year reaped a hundredfold."
