ASK FATHER JAMES:

“Put out into the deep water” (Luke 5:1-11)

This Sunday's gospel reading invites us into a world of revelation and adventure, trusting in Jesus. Jesus said to Peter, “put out your nets into deep waters for a catch...” In the midst of failure, Jesus asks Peter to go deeper, not only into the lake waters but also into his experience of God's abundant and caring inspiration. The phrase also recalls what God said to Abraham (Genesis 12:1-9), and he obeyed God and set out from his home city. According to Biblical tradition, God's promise was fulfilled, and Abraham became the father of a great people.

When Jesus said same to Peter, Peter tried to make some excuses but eventually obeyed and caught such a great haul of fish that the nets were even breaking. During difficult times, we too like Peter can be tempted to assume that we have exhausted all our avenues and resources, but we should always remember that we live in a world characterized more by abundance than scarcity. Cast nets again—this time in deep water. This most likely would mean a bit more work and time. This can be through prayer and worship. Prayer can truly be hard work, painful work, deep work. So is worship. But like Peter, do it!


