Ask Fr James

In the Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit

"In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" as recorded by Jesus in Matthew 28:16-20 is the origin of the "Trinitarian formula" that we use in administering baptism, to make the sign of the cross, to pray the Glory be to the Father and the priest uses it as the sign of priestly blessing or benediction and in giving absolution - divine authority to forgive sins. In that text, Jesus said to his disciples after his resurrection, before the ascension;

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them *in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit*, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

This text is popularly known as the "Apostolic Commissioning" or the "Great Commissioning." What makes the Great Commission truly great is that it addresses not only the eleven disciples at Galilee, but also all of the many other disciples who follow after them.

By the great commission to baptize, the disciples are fully vested with divine authority which includes the instruction that baptism is to be done in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The reason we can go into all the world and share the Gospel is because Jesus now has all power in heaven and earth. And, as His ambassadors (2 Corinthians 5:20), we have that power too.

Note that Jesus' command was the charge to baptize first and teach later. This provides the basis for infant baptism in the Catholic Church. Baptism and teaching need to go together. In the Catholic Church, the reason we baptize infants is because we receive promises that the baptized infant will be taught.

This text also explains the origin of the doctrine of the Trinity. On Trinity Sunday we re-connect with the Trinitarian formula with which we were baptized and the three persons in one true Godhead. There has been erroneous misconception amongst many people that believe in the Trinity means to be polytheist (that belief in the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit means to believe in three gods). They argue that this dogma is contrary to reason itself and it splits God in three and that it was not prefigured in the Old Testament.

The Church's response is that the Christian faith is based exclusively in the understanding that God alone has the right to name himself. . . and that 'God' according to the Christian tradition is defined as the relationship between the Father, Son, and Spirit.. the relationships between God, Christ and the Spirit are mutual and do not compromise the fundamental "oneness" or "unity" that obtains between them. This doctrine of Father, Son and Holy Spirit is biblical; it is a revealed doctrine - a doctrine we would not know apart from the self-revelation of God in Jesus Christ and it is the reason it is rooted in the creed.
