Christians are faithful Servants waiting for the Master

In the Parable of the Watchful Servants (Luke 12:32-48), Jesus enjoins us to be like those faithful servant-managers waiting for their master to return. Jesus is coming again. This scriptural text is the background to what we profess in the Nicene creed: "and He shall come again, with glory, to judge the quick and the dead; and His kingdom shall have no end." Jesus knows that it's possible to become disillusioned as we wait and we stop praying, stop going to Mass and stop practicing the Christian life. He says: "The Son of Man may come at an hour when we do not expect him." Is your spiritual life going down fast? Are you becoming too complacent spiritually? This lesson is for you. Jesus says: "Be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning like men waiting for their master to return from a wedding banquet, so that when he comes and knocks, they can immediately open the door for him" (Luke 12:35-36). Jesus concludes by saying: "It will be good for those servants whose master finds ready, even if he comes in the second or third watch of the night" (Luke 12:38).

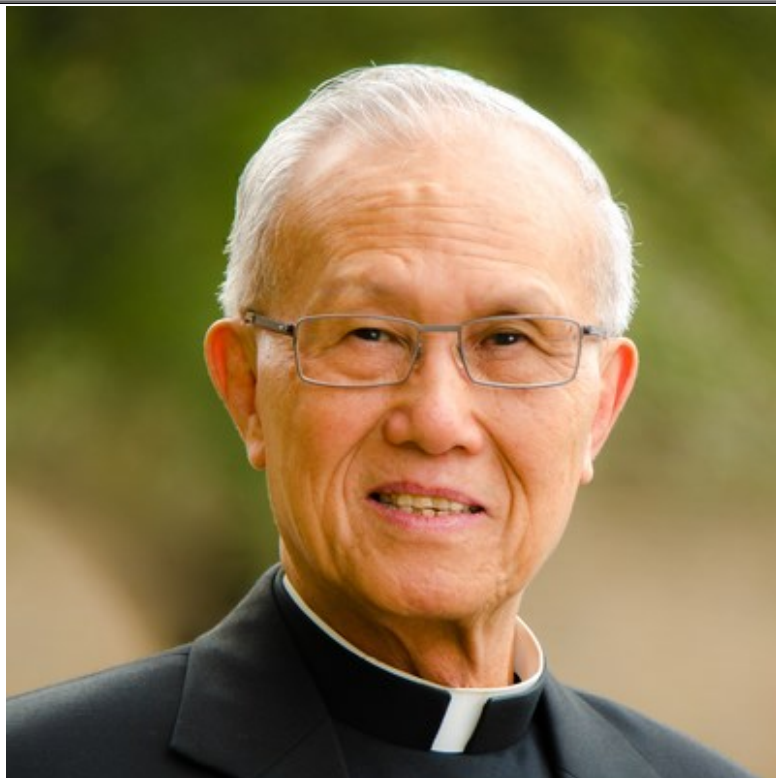
