

ASK FATHER JAMES:

"Give us this day our daily bread" Luke 11:3

This weekend's Gospel text is about the necessity of prayer in the life of a Christian disciple. Jesus teaches us how to pray the "Our Father prayer." So rightly called the Lord's Prayer because Christ himself gave it to us (Luke 11:1-13). God educates us through prayer to look towards him and so learn what to pray for. One of the requests we make in that prayer is "Give us this day our daily bread." This can be understood as a request for material and spiritual food. It is an expression of our ongoing dependence on God, asking for provision for the material and spiritual food we need to survive this life's exigencies. The simplicity of the Lord's Prayer is based on the assurance that the Lord hears our requests, knows our needs, and will respond in a way that accords with the goodness of God's character. The catechism of the catholic Church admonishes us that this request for daily bread can be generally reduced only to mean praying for our basic daily necessities. (CCC 2837). The request for "Our daily bread" goes far above our basic needs for sustenance and invokes our supernatural needs. St. Jerome translated the Bible in the 4th century from the original Latin, Hebrew and Greek texts to form the Latin Vulgate Bible. He translated the request as "supersubstantial bread," and explains that this is a request for a bread that is above all substances and surpasses all creatures." This understanding has Eucharistic overtones, as the Catechism states, "the Eucharist is already the foretaste of the kingdom to come." (CCC 2837).




