ASK FATHER JAMES:

“Love your enemies and do good to those who hate you” - Luke 6:32-34

When Jesus admonishes us to “love your enemies and do good to those who hate you and bless those who curse you,” he is not encouraging teatime with the devil. G.K. Chesterton (1874-1936) opines that the reason why Jesus advises that we love our neighbours and love our enemies is probably because they are probably the same people! Henri Nouwen explains that to “pray for those who hate you” is so that we mention one another in our prayers. Prayer allows us to lead into the center of God’s heart, not only those who love us but also those who hate us. And Dietrich Bonhoeffer says, “the more animosity the enemy has, the more my love is required.”

Jesus’ command is that loving God and loving people (including those we don’t like) are the two greatest commandments. In fact, these two commands summarize all the teachings contained in the Law and the Prophets (Matthew 22:36-40). Jesus also declared that His disciples would be recognized by their love (John 13:35). When Jesus’ powerful ministry began on earth over 2000 years ago, He faced a similar situation that we too face today. Some people hated him but nevertheless, Jesus prayed for his persecutors from on top of the cross (Luke 23:34). Also, St. Stephen prayed for his executors as they were stoning him to death (Acts of the Apostles 7:60).

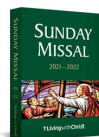
