ASK FATHER JAMES:

Martha Opens her Home to Jesus: But Jesus is the Host (Luke 10:38)

Today's Gospel tells a story about two sisters, Martha and Mary, holy women who loved Jesus and opened their home to welcome Jesus. The text says: "As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, he came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to him." (Luke 10:38). And then Martha was trying to play the host. Jesus reminds Martha, that she is distracted from focusing on the "host." She was so distracted that she was not able to take advantage of Christ's presence in her home. Mary on the other hand, "sat at the feet of Jesus' feet." Jesus's response to Martha with a particular focus on the phrases "one thing is necessary" and "Mary has chosen the best part," was referring to Martha's misplaced attention. At every Mass, Christ is present, but we can easily miss his presence by several distractions. Jesus is the host is the consecrated bread of the Eucharist; from the Latin root, 'hostia', meaning a sacrificial victim. Martha was trying to play the host and as a consequence, limiting her own spiritual blessing from the hostia. Jesus says that Mary "has chosen the better part" by listening to divine presence and enjoying the spiritual benefit. Mary is simply doing what all Christians should be doing, and Jesus is trying to encourage Martha to do likewise. However, Jesus is not advocating idleness. That 'Mary sat at the feet of Jesus,' does he mean that she did nothing else throughout her whole life.






