

ASK FATHER JAMES: The interpretation of Jesus' beatitude of the poor and woe to the Rich (Luke 6:17-26)

Jesus says, "Blessed are you who are poor..."But woe to you who are rich" (Luke 6:20; 24). This text is often very troubling, but I think there is a message for everyone in the blessing for the poor and the woe to those who refuse to take action on behalf of the poor. In Catholic social teaching, the fundamental option for the poor is a call to all. Without any doubt poverty is one of the most urgent problems in our time. It is an old problem, that is quickly increasing. We must caution ourselves against a narrow, simple definition of the poor as those who do not have. Jesus' beatitude helps clarify who the poor are. They are the hungry, the sorrowing people, those who suffer injustice and whose poverty is produced by mechanisms of impoverishment and exploitation. The hungry and thirsty and strangers and naked and sick and captives (Matthew. 25:35f). This poverty is both evil and unjust. These people will continue to be victims of this abiding disease of society if we Christian and church did nothing to address the economic, social, and political situations and structures that perpetuate this evil. What we as church and Catholic Christians can do is become involved in the struggle of the poor. We must take the poor seriously as an integral part of the Body of Christ. Christians nowadays have access to all institutional tools of economy governance and developmental politics and authority in the church – on national levels as well as on the global level. If we do not use this influence to reduce the "production" of poverty, Jesus says to us too, "woe to you who are rich" (Luke 6:24). Charity always is a Christian duty, but it is not enough. It has to be accompanied by the struggle for justice in economic and political structures.




